In June, we were excited to announce that Olle Liljelund, an eleventh grade public school student at Hudson High School of Learning Technologies, was named the winner of ETM's first-ever High School Student Composition Contest!

Olle wrote his composition during his music class this year, inspired by the impact of gun violence and racism experienced by students throughout the country. The Composition Contest was based upon the ETM-authored music technology unit, "Tray Beats for Change." In this unit, students learned about the tray sub-genre of hip hop and produced an original composition by reating tray beats and incorporating audio samples that promote a social justice cause. We received so many moving pieces, and are thrilled that our curriculum and teachers are enabling students to create musically sophisticated, thought provoking compositions. Thank you to Chris Atlas, ETM Board member, for judging the submissions and choosing this powerful piece as the winner.
